UNESCO's organization of the United Nations Inter-Agency Games in 2025 is meaningful for more reasons than one. Not only does this year mark the 50th edition of this competition, created at the initiative of UNESCO in 1968, but it is also the 80th anniversary of our organization.

There could be no better host city for this year's Games than Rennes. In addition to being the beating heart of Brittany and a metropolis of art and history, it is a city of sport. It has nearly 395 sport facilities, including Roazhon Park stadium and Glaz Arena, where the closing ceremony will take place.

In 2025, the Inter-Agency Games will bring together over 1,300 athletes from 138 countries and 64 United Nations organizations and agencies, reminding us once again how



the values of sport underpin our daily work to build peace. Teamwork, integrity, respect, equity, inclusion - all these qualities are just as necessary on the sports field as they are in our initiatives around the world.

May this festive competition be an opportunity for us to surpass ourselves, gather together and, above all, strengthen ties – a vibrant reflection of multilateralism in action.

INTRODUCTION



The United Nations Inter-Agency Games (UNIAG) will celebrate a major milestone this year with its 50th Edition.

Since its inception in 1968, the UNIAG has brought together UN personnel from across the globe in the spirit of sportsmanship, collaboration, and solidarity. These events playfully nicknamed the UN mini–Olympic Games, were deemed worthy to be established every year as they enabled a deeper sense of connection and even friendship between UN Agencies and civil servants from various backgrounds and countries. Each edition offered a chance for staff to connect beyond duty stations — whether through competition or shared experience.

After 57 years of sports challenges, the Games are proudly hosted this year by UNESCO from 14 to 18 May 2025, in Rennes, France. As is customary, an Opening Ceremony will be followed by two to three days of competitions, leading to the highlight of the event which is the Closing Ceremony and gala dinner where our best athletes will be rewarded with medals.

The 50th edition aims to highlight local partnerships and foster a memorable, community-centered experience.









RENNES, FRANCE

A CITY OF CHARACTER

Rennes is the capital of the Britanny region. It is filled with Art, Culture, History, and is of course infused with the Breton culture that can be seen at every corner of the city. To honor this heritage, we have chosen to have the Opening Ceremony at the heart of the city, in the 'Couvent des Jacobins', an ancient 14th century convent turned into a Congress center.

A SMALL AND FRIENDLY CITY

Rennes is nicknamed, rightfully, the « fifteen minutes » city, as everything is accessible on foot or by public transport in this time frame. As such, competitions will mostly be accessible by public transportation, with the exception of a few disciplines, for which shuttles will be organized (details in the Sports and Venues section). But, no worry, these are located at a maximum of 20 min from the city center.

A SPORTS CITY

Rennes has 395 sports facilities accessible to everyone and regularly hosts major sports events and competitions. Its inhabitants show strong enthusiasm for football games, and its Stade Rennais (Roazhon Park) is the place to be whenever a match is organized. Another major place for sports gatherings is the Glaz Arena, where we have decided to host you for the Closing ceremony.

A GREEN AND SUSTAINABLE CITY

Rennes is the second greenest city in France. The Breton capital is also one of the five French cities labeled Innovative and Sustainable Destination by Bureau Veritas, a national standard managed by the 'France Congress and Event network'.

Destination Rennes, its Tourist Office, is labeled ISO 20121. This international norm is a reference in terms of responsible management of events activities and recognizes the exemplary nature of the actions undertaken to welcome tourists and participants in professional events.



It is thanks to the precious help from the Rennes municipality, the Sports Directorate of Rennes City, and Destination Rennes (Tourist Office) that we are thrilled to be able to welcome you there for this 50th Edition.

ARRIVALS

ARRIVAL AT RENNES AIRPORT

Location: 1 Av. de l'Aéroport Joseph le Brix, 35136 Saint-Jacques-de-la-Lande

Please be aware, the Organizing Committee of the 50th UN IAG is not organizing bus shuttles to and from Rennes City Center.

Unlimited cards for public transportation for the whole duration of your stay until Sunday 18 May will be included in your welcome package.

→ You can reach the city center by **bus** on **Line ^{C6}**. This line runs every day (Sundays and public holidays included). From Monday to Friday, with an average frequency of 10 to 12 minutes between 7 am and 7 pm This line is accessible to people with reduced mobility.

Ticket cost from the airport: €1.80 and can be purchased at the airport information desk.

→ You can also reach the city center **by train**, but you will have to walk 15 min to reach the <u>train</u> station. You will then have a 5 min train ride.

SECURITY

With regard to safety/security rules for your participation in the IAG, we would like to remind you of the United Nations' recommendations.

First and foremost, we would like to remind you of the reflexes you should have for any trip, and which apply to your stay in Rennes.

While UNSMS staff continue to be victims of minor crime such as pickpocketing and apartment break-ins, the infrequency of attacks and random nature of locations do not indicate that UN staff are at an elevated risk in comparison to residents or tourists in France. However, just as in any other urban context, personnel are advised to take care of their belongings on public transport and in crowded areas in city centers. In addition, always lock your vehicle and never leave valuables in cars; avoid leaving luggage in cars for any length of time

We strongly recommend that you log on to the <u>UNSMS website</u> with your organization's login details and fill in your <u>security clearance</u> with the precise addresses of your accommodation in Rennes.

Saint-Malo is a fortified port city in Brittany, known for its historic ramparts, beaches and rich maritime heritage. It's a popular destination for its coastal scenery and medieval atmosphere.

Enjoy a moment of relaxation at the <u>Aquatonic</u> or at the Saint Malo <u>thermal baths</u>, both ideally located on the seafront.

A direct train from Rennes can take you there in 50 minutes. Trains depart regularly throughout the day.

SPORT CHARTER of the United Nations Inter-Agency Games 2025

50th Edition - Rennes, 14 to 18 May 2025

Since 1968, the United Nations Inter-Agency Games have celebrated unity, diversity, and solidarity among staff members from UN agencies around the world. This 50th edition offers a unique opportunity to promote team spirit, cultural exchange, solidarity, and the universal values of sport.

PURPOSE OF THIS CHARTER

To ensure an atmosphere of fair play, mutual respect, and friendliness for all participants (athletes, supporters, volunteers, and organizers).

OUR SHARED VALUES

Respect for the game and the rules

All participants commit to respecting the rules specific to each sport and to accepting the decisions of referees, officials, and volunteers, in a spirit of fair play and collective responsibility.

Respect for individuals

Discriminatory, aggressive, intimidating, or disrespectful behavior will not be tolerated—on or off the field.

Team spirit and solidarity

Each delegation and participant represent not only their organization but also the shared ideals of the United Nations system: peace, cooperation, diversity, inclusion, solidarity, and respect for human rights. As a reminder, the Standards of Conduct for the International Civil Service also apply during the Games.

Responsible supporters

Spectators are here to cheer, not to judge or provoke. Unsportsmanlike behavior in the stands or around the playing areas is prohibited.
